Reference: Vanuatu Flag Circular - "Zero Tolerance for Fraudulent Documentation - Immediate Deregistration"

Dear Owners and Operators of Vanuatu Flagged Vessels,

This circular is prepared by URACOS Classification Society to inform you about a significant circular issued by the Vanuatu Flag, titled "Zero Tolerance for Fraudulent Documentation - Immediate Deregistration".

The Vanuatu Flag, demonstrating its commitment to ensuring integrity and legal compliance in the maritime sector, has initiated a zero-tolerance policy against the use of fraudulent or misleading documentation. The issued circular explicitly states that in the event of fraudulent documentation being detected on Vanuatu flagged vessels, the vessel in question will be immediately deregistered from the Vanuatu Ship Registry.

This measure aims to ensure full compliance of the Vanuatu Flag with international maritime standards and regulations, and to protect the flag's reputation. The use of fraudulent documentation is a serious issue that damages the credibility not only of the Vanuatu Flag but of the entire maritime industry, and it is imperative to combat such activities decisively.

In this regard, it is of utmost importance for all owners and operators of Vanuatu flagged vessels to pay maximum attention to the points outlined below and to take the necessary measures immediately:

Document Authenticity and Validity: Ensure that all documents related to your vessels (vessel registration documents, class certificates, safety certificates, crew competency certificates, etc.) are original, accurate, and valid. Forged documents or documents with any form of alteration are strictly unacceptable.

Document Verification: Conduct regular checks of the documents used on your vessels, and in case of any suspicion, immediately contact the Vanuatu Maritime Administration.

Personnel Awareness: Ensure that your vessel personnel are informed about this new regulation and warned about the consequences of using fraudulent documentation.

The "Immediate Deregistration" sanction to be applied upon detection of fraudulent documentation may lead to serious disruptions in your vessel operations, commercial losses, and legal issues. To avoid such negative consequences, it is in your best interest to meticulously review your document management processes and take all necessary preventative measures.

We urge all shipowners/operators to ensure that only authentic and verifiable documents are submitted to the Administration. Any attempt to manipulate records or provide counterfeit documentation will result in severe consequences, including but not limited to flag withdrawal and legal actions.

This serves as a final and absolute warning. Compliance is not optional.
